Prof. Florencio López-de-Silanes specializes in Financial Markets, Legal Reform, Privatization and Deregulation. He has been an Economic Advisor to several governments on critical issues such as financial markets' reform and privatization. He has advised the Russian, Peruvian, Malaysian, Egyptian, Yemenian and Mexican governments on issues of privatization, deregulation, corporate and bankruptcy law, industrial policy and financial regulation. He has been an Economic Advisor to the Ministry of Industry and Trade in Mexico and a Consultant to the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Communications and Transportation in issues of privatization. In Russia, he has served as an Advisor on public policy regarding privatization and bankruptcy law. More recently, he has also worked as a consultant to the International Monetary Fund and to the World Bank on issues of corporate governance, bankruptcy and corporate law in connection with the Asian Crisis. He is currently an Economic Advisor to the National Banking and Stock Market Commission of Mexico, and a founding member of the Board in charge of designing the Code of Best Corporate Practices to be followed by firms listed in the Mexican Stock Exchange. Prof. Lopez-de-Silanes also serves as Board member in several U.S. and international corporations. His main publications fall in the areas of finance, legal reform of financial markets, corporate and bankruptcy law, privatization, and trade and industrial policy particularly with respect to NAFTA. He received Harvard's Wells Prize for the Best Dissertation in Economics (1995), and won the First Place National Award of Law and Economics at the National Association of Law and Economics in Mexico (1996). He graduated with highest honors from Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México, and he has a Masters and a Ph.D. in Economics (Financial Economics, International Trade, and Industrial Organization) from Harvard University.
