

Biographical Statement

Raghuram Rajan is the Joseph L. Gidwitz Professor of Finance at the Graduate School of Business, University of Chicago. Rajan received his Ph.D. in 1991 from the Sloan School of Management at M.I.T. He has taught courses on corporate finance and financial institutions. His research interests include organizational behavior, corporate financial policy, financial intermediation, regulation, and the politics of financial development. His articles have appeared in academic journals, books and newspapers, and he has been honored twice with the Smith Breeden prize awarded by the Journal of Finance. Rajan has been a consultant for various financial institutions, the Bertil Danielsson visiting Professor of Banking at the Stockholm School of Economics, and visiting Professor of Finance at the Kellogg School, Northwestern University. He is the Director of the Corporate Finance Program at the National Bureau of Economic Research and is an associate editor of a number of economics and finance journals.
