

T. N. SRINIVASAN

Brief Biographical Description

T. N. Srinivasan is the Samuel C. Park, Jr. Professor of Economics and Chairman of the Department of Economics at Yale University. He was a Professor, and later Research Professor, at the Indian Statistical Institute, Delhi (1964-1977). He has also taught at numerous universities, including the University of Minnesota, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Johns Hopkins University and Stanford University. In addition, Professor Srinivasan has worked extensively with the World Bank, serving for three years as a Special Adviser to the Development Research Center (1977-1980), as a member of the Editorial Board of the World Bank Review (1986-1991), and returning for numerous short-term consultancies with the World Development Report (1991) and the Economic Development Institute (1995). Professor Srinivasan has published extensively on International Trade, Development, Agricultural Economics and Microeconomic Theory. His most recent books, Lectures on International Trade (with Jagdish Bhagwati) and Developing Countries and the Multilateral Trading System: From the GATT (1947) to the Uruguay Round and the Future Beyond. have just been published. He co-edited The Handbook of Development Economics (Volumes 1, 2, and 3), General Equilibrium Trade Policy Modeling, Rural Poverty in South Asia, Poverty and Income Distribution in India, Population, Food, and Rural Development, and Applied General Equilibrium Analysis and Economic Development. He is co-author of Lectures on International Trade, India's Economic Reforms, and Agricultural Growth and Redistribution of Income. He has co-edited several journals, including Econometrica and Journal of Development Economics. Professor Srinivasan is a Fellow of the American Philosophical Society, the Econometric Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Yale University.
