

Kimberlee A. Shauman is an assistant professor of sociology at the University of California, Davis. Her main areas of interest are social stratification, family and kinship, demography, sociology of education, and quantitative methodology. Her research focuses on sex differences in career development and outcomes with particular attention to the causal effects of family characteristics. She is co-author (with Yu Xie) of the book, *Women in Science: Career Processes and Outcomes*, that examines sex differences in participation in the science and engineering career trajectory from a life course perspective. She is currently studying sex differences in the career causes and consequences of family migration and gender differences in the leadership of academic departments at research universities in the U.S. (jointly with Deb Niemeier).
